## **The Performance Pathway Means:**

## **Leaders Model Culture Modeling Behavior that Gets Results**

- 1. This is the foundation of his "R Factor" training.
- 2. How did Jesus select his disciples?
  - Did they have natural talent for the positions Jesus would entrust them with?
- 3. Do you believe that you can aspire to skills for which you don't have the natural talent?

Yes – IF YOU ARE WILLING TO DO THE WORK AND RECEIVE FEEDBACK.

#### It Takes Culture:

- 1. The word "Culture" comes from the Latin "core" which means heart. It's where our values and world view reside. *Not on Paper*.
- 2. <u>LEADERS ARE THE CATALYST TO DRIVE OUR CULTURE</u> AT FOCAS/LORD'S GYM MINISTRIES. This is the BIG IDEA. Leaders and their ability to influence *spiritually* make the difference!!!

## Proposition statements, thoughts, and reality check:

- You can't build a culture that you don't talk about!!!
- It is hard to do! It takes everyone.
- It is a mindset requiring continuous skillset development.
- It takes focus, energy, commitment, and accountability.
- Are we willing to seek the Lord and do the work to continually deepen our relationship with God and others is the bottom line? Again, are we growing STRONGER in the Lord each day? Skill development will also likely be required.

## Culture is built. Culture is nurtured. It is not declared!

Cultivate a Get Better Mindset and Learn to Embrace the Discomfort.

- Six (6) key components of his "R-Factor" thinking.
  (By Tim Kight of FOCUS 3: Culture, Leadership, Behavior)
  - 1. How do we <u>typically</u> choose to respond to a given event or situation for the outcome we desire or need? E+R=O
  - 2. We have to know our *Objective*!
  - 3. Understanding Discipline over Default Behavior/Reactions
  - 4. The 7 components to Reacting:
    - 1. R1 Press Pause (Loose the anxiety.)
    - 2. R2 Get Your Mind Right (Draw closer God.)
    - 3. R3 Step Up

- 4. R4 Always Show Respect: To God, To Self, To Others, Property, Authority, & Environment.
- 5. R5 Adjust & Adapt (Build Character/Sanctification/Become more like Christ!)
- 6. R6 Make a Difference
- **7.** R7 Build Skill
- 5. We have to "Do the Work". There is no other way.
- 6. We don't Blame, Complain, or Defend NO BCD

#### Cultivate a Get Better Mindset and Learn to Embrace the Discomfort

- James 1:2-3 ESV Count it all joy, my brethren, when ye fall into manifold temptations; knowing that the proving of your faith worketh patience.
- Ps 20:4 May he grant you your heart's desire and fulfill all your plans!
- 1 Timothy 4:7 (ESV) Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths.
  - Rather TRAIN yourself for godliness;
- **Jeremiah 29:11** For I know the **plans** I have for you, declares the LORD, **plans** for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.
- Proverbs 15: 14 The heart of him who has understanding **seeks knowledge**, but the mouths of fools feed on folly.

## <u>Component #1 - E + R = O (Event + Reaction = Outcome)</u>

- Event or situation we can't control.
- What is our desired outcome? TRANSFORMED LIVES (short version)
- Will our reaction be one of Discipline or Default behavior?
- Is our reaction in line with God's word?
- Is it moving us toward our Objective = A Transformed Life!

We must Know our <u>Objective</u>! – [FOCAS' OGSMs and Strategy] A <u>transformed</u> <u>life that glorifies God Philippians 1:27</u>! This means US, FOCAS Board Members and Staff - first! and, our family's, volunteers, partners, and friends. To <u>"grow</u> <u>stronger in the Lord and the power of his might." Eph 6.10</u>)

## **E + R = O** (Prayerfully Consider)

- 1 Thessalonians 2:13 And we also thank God constantly[a] for this, that when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men[b] but as what it really is, the word of God, which is at work in you believers.

And to him who lacks sense she says, 17 "Stolen water is sweet, and bread eaten in secret is pleasant." 18 But he does not know that the dead[d] are there, 15 calling to those who pass by, who are going straight on their way,16 "Whoever is simple, let him turn in here!"

- **Proverbs 10:4-5** <sup>4</sup> A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich. <sup>5</sup> He who gathers in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps in harvest is a son who brings shame.
- **Proverbs 10:17** <sup>17</sup> Whoever heeds instruction (discipline) is on the path to life, but he who rejects reproof leads others astray.
- **Proverbs 10:22 and other Proverbs** God's practical guidance about money. (It can be hard to hear and do. *It's more comfortable to continue in our habits* than to learn how to use money wisely.) Consider the following verses: (E+R=O)

# Component #2 - Knowing your objective of E + R = O is critical! (Our Objective is to BE TRANSFORMED!)

## Knowing one's objective requires:

- 1. Self Awareness
- 2. Mental Toughness

## **Scriptural Support:**

- 1 Thes 2:13 And we also thank God constantly for this, that when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men<sup>[b]</sup> but as what it really is, the word of God, which is at work in you believers.
- Read God's Word. Ps:1.1-3. 1 Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; 2 but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. 3 He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.
- **Joshua 1:8** This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.

## • We will be tested (Good to know):

- Genesis 22:1 [ *The Sacrifice of Isaac* ] After these things God **tested** Abraham and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am."

Component #3: Discipline versus Default Behavior/Reactions

**STOP** and honestly ask yourself –

"How do I respond to most situations, especially stressful ones?"

Below is how we typically choose to respond to a given event or situation. We respond in one of two ways: Discipline versus Default. Begin thinking of our reaction as one of either above the line or below the line imagery.

## <u>Discipline</u> Default

The leading question becomes, <u>"Are we acting above or below the line?"</u> This is pretty simple and straight forward once the vernacular is explained and taught to the team.

Where does our typical behavior lie or dwell? Do we need to make changes to reach our objectives and goals? Are we willing to do the work and get out of our comfort zone? Are willing to change? Are we willing to receive feedback and do the necessary work to achieve the outcome(s) we desire?

## <u>Discipline</u> Default

Above vs Below the Line Thinking & Behavior D/D is an attitude and behavior (See RAW acronym below as it relates to "Do the Work"):

## D/D Scriptural Support:

- 2 Timothy 3:16 <u>All Scripture</u> is breathed out <u>by God</u> and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,
- Acts 20:27 for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God.
- Yagottawanadoit (boils down to desire do ya want it?)
- Romans 15:4 For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.
- Proverbs 19:27 Cease to hear instruction, my son, and you will stray from the words
  of knowledge.
- **Ephesians 6:4** Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.
- <u>1 Thessalonians 5:12</u> [ Final Instructions and Benediction ] We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you,
- Phil 1:27 Only let your manner of life be worthy[a] of the gospel of Christ, so that
  whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing

## D/D Scriptural Support Continued:

- **Proverbs. 1:10** If sinners entice you, do not give into them.
- o 1 Cor 15:33 Do not be deceived: "Bad company ruins good morals."
- o **Proverbs 1:22** How long, O simple ones, will you love **being** simple? How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?
- **Proverbs 13:18** Poverty and disgrace come to him who ignores instruction, but whoever heeds reproof is honored. <sup>19</sup> A desire fulfilled is sweet to the soul, but to turn away from evil is an abomination to fools. <sup>20</sup> Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm.
- **(For Youth) Proverbs 15:5** A fool despises his father's instruction, but whoever heeds reproof is prudent.
- **Proverbs 15:21-23**; 21 Folly is a joy to him who lacks sense, but a man of understanding walks straight ahead. 22 Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers they succeed. 23 To make an apt answer is a joy to a man, and a word in season, how good it is!
- **Proverbs 15:** 31-33; 31 The ear that listens to life-giving reproof will dwell among the wise. 32 Whoever ignores instruction despises himself, but he who listens to reproof gains intelligence. 33 The fear of the Lord is instruction in wisdom, and humility comes before honor.
- Proverbs 16: 20-24; 20 Whoever gives thought to the word will discover good, and blessed is he who trusts in the Lord. 21 The wise of heart is called discerning, and sweetness of speech increases persuasiveness. 22 Good sense is a fountain of life to him who has it, but the instruction of fools is folly. 23 The heart of the wise makes his speech judicious and adds persuasiveness to his lips. 24 Gracious words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body.
- **Proverbs 17:**10 A rebuke goes deeper into a man of understanding than a hundred blows into a fool.
- **Proverbs 18: 1-2;** Whoever isolates himself seeks his own desire; he breaks out against all sound judgment. <sup>2</sup> A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing his opinion.
- **Proverbs 20:11** Do not love sleep or you will grow poor; stay awake and you will have food to spare.
- **Proverbs 21: 25** The craving of a sluggard will be the death of him, because his hands refuse to work. 26 All day long he craves for more, but the righteous give without sparing.

## D/D Scriptural Support Continued:

- **Proverbs 22: 1-2** A good name is more desirable than great riches; to be esteemed is better than silver or gold. 2 Rich and poor have this in common: The Lord is the Maker of them all.
- Proverbs 22 17-21 Thirty Sayings of the Wise Saying 1 = 17 Pay attention and turn your ear to the sayings of the wise; apply your heart to what I teach, 18 for it is pleasing when you keep them in your heart and have all of them ready on your lips. 19 So that your trust may be in the Lord, I teach you today, even you. 20 Have I not written thirty sayings for you, sayings of counsel and knowledge, 21 teaching you to be honest and to speak the truth, so that you bring back truthful reports to those you serve?
- **Proverbs 23:12-14** <sup>12</sup> Apply your heart to instruction and your ears to words of knowledge. <sup>13</sup> Do not withhold discipline from a child; if you punish them with the rod, they will not die. <sup>14</sup> Punish them with the rod and save them from death.
- Proverbs 24: <sup>13</sup> Eat honey, my son, for it is good; honey from the comb is sweet to your taste. <sup>14</sup> Know also that wisdom is like honey for you: If you find it, there is a future hope for you, and your hope will not be cut off.
- **Proverbs 28:19** Those who work their land will have abundant food, but those who chase fantasies will have their fill of poverty.
- **Proverbs 29**:1 Whoever remains stiff-necked after many rebukes will suddenly be destroyed—without remedy.

## Key Take-a-ways from Discipline over Default:

- It's our choice to learn and to grow: Spiritually, Physically, Emotionally, and Mentally
- 2. The process is SLOW, SMALL, & DAILY
- 3. It's intentional
- 4. It takes mental toughness and some resiliency.
- 5. Comes from maturity and school of hard knocks.
- 6. It comes from feedback from trusted sources. It's okay to be accountable and vulnerable to God and others!
- 7. Sometimes we have to be reminded. Okay to write them down.

## Component # 4 – The Seven (7) "R Factors":

Situational Awareness and R Factor reactions. Consider the following 7 Components:

**What is situational awareness?** Taking the necessary time to evaluate all of the variables that are impacting the situation that are bearing down on any given situation. Realize what variables are and are not within your control to influence.

## R1 – Press Pause A VERYYYY Tactical First Step!! (Get yourself under control.)

- Psalm 46:10 -Be still, and know that I am God.
- <u>1 Sam 12:16</u> Now therefore stand still and see this great thing that the Lord will do before your eyes.
- 1 Thessalonians 5:18 give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.
- Proverbs 25:28 A man without **self-control** is like a city broken into and left without walls.
- Acts 24:25 And as he reasoned about righteousness and self-control and the coming judgment, Felix was alarmed and said, "Go away for the present. When I get an opportunity I will summon you."
- <u>1 Corinthians 7:5</u> Do not deprive one another, except perhaps by agreement for a limited time, that you may devote yourselves to prayer; but then come together again, so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of **self-control**.
- **1 Corinthians 7:9** But if they cannot exercise **self-control**, they should marry. For it is better to marry than to burn with passion.
- <u>1 Corinthians 9:25</u> Every athlete exercises **self-control** in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable.
- Galatians 5:23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.
- <u>1 Timothy 2:9</u> likewise also that women should adorn themselves in respectable apparel, with modesty and **self-control**, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly attire,
- <u>1 Timothy 2:15</u> Yet she will be saved through childbearing—if they continue in faith and love and holiness, with **self-control**.
- <u>1 Timothy 3:2</u> Therefore an overseer must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, sober-minded, **self-control**led, respectable, hospitable, able to teach,
- <u>2 Timothy 1:7</u> for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.
- <u>2 Timothy 3:3</u> heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without **self-control**, brutal, not loving good,
- <u>Titus 1:8</u> but hospitable, a lover of good, **self-control**led, upright, holy, and disciplined.
- <u>Titus 2:2</u> Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, **self-control**led, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness.

#### R1 - Press Pause Continued

- <u>Titus 2:5</u> to be **self-control**led, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled.
- **Titus 2:6** Likewise, urge the younger men to be **self-control**led.
- <u>Titus 2:12</u> training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live **self-control**led, upright, and godly lives in the present age,
- <u>1 Peter 4:7</u> The end of all things is at hand; therefore be **self-control**led and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers.
- <u>2 Peter 1:6</u> and knowledge with **self-control**, and **self-control** with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness,
- **Proverbs 14:8 & 15** The wisdom of the prudent is to discern his way, but the folly of fools is deceiving.
- **Proverbs 20: 24 & 27** 24 A person's steps are directed by the Lord. How then can anyone understand their own way? 27 The human spirit is[a] the lamp of the Lord that sheds light on one's inmost being.
- **Proverbs 21:23** Those who guard their mouths and their tongue keep themselves from calamity.

### Ephesians Chapter 4

- 25 Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another.
- <sup>26</sup> Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, <sup>27</sup> and give no opportunity to the devil.
- 28 Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need.

- 5 **Put to death** therefore what is earthly in you:

- <sup>17</sup> And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

- 2 Timothy 4:5 As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.
- **Hebrews 6:10** For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the love that you have shown for his name in serving the saints, as you still do.
- Psalm 20:4 May he grant you your heart's desire and fulfill all your plans!
- **Psalm 33:10** The LORD brings the counsel of the nations to nothing; he frustrates the **plans** of the peoples.
- **Proverbs 15:22** Without counsel **plans** fail, but with many advisers they succeed.

- Phil 2:14-16 Do all things without grumbling or disputing, <sup>15</sup> that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, <sup>16</sup> holding fast to the word of life,
- <u>Peter 4:9</u> Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.
- **Proverbs 16: 27-28**; 27 A worthless man plots evil, and his speech is like a scorching fire. 28 A dishonest man spreads strife, and a whisperer separates close friends.
- Proverbs 17: 4-5 & 9; 4 An evildoer listens to wicked lips, and a liar gives ear to a
  mischievous tongue. 5 Whoever mocks the poor insults his Maker; he who is glad at
  calamity will not go unpunished. 9 Whoever covers an offense seeks love, but he
  who repeats a matter separates close friends.
- **Proverbs 17: 27-28;** Whoever restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding. 28 Even a fool who keeps silent is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is deemed intelligent.

## **NO BCD Continued**

- **Proverbs 18:**8 The words of a gossiper are like delicious morsels; they go down into the inner parts of the body.
- Proverbs 20: 19 A gossip betrays a confidence; so avoid anyone who talks too much.
- **Proverbs 26:20-22** Without wood a fire goes out; without a gossip a quarrel dies down. 21 As charcoal to embers and as wood to fire, so is a quarrelsome person for kindling strife. 22 The words of a gossip are like choice morsels; they go down to the inmost parts.
- Matthew 18:15-17 "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. 16 But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. 17 If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church.
